The facility director, Tim Dimick pointed out they had been given permission to put this room in and that it was unfair to site them. Licensing worked with Greenacres to make accommodations such as doorknob removal.

One of the boys gave this commissioner a brief tour of the building, fire extinguishers and Halloween costumes. He excused himself to go wait for a phone call. Another boy took over the tour. He was excited to show the house and what he wanted to be for Halloween. Both agreed the food was good. They loved the staff. One of the boys spent some time teasing the staff and showing off. The staff was very patient with his antics.

INSPECTION SUMMARY:

Overall the house is comfortable, not fancy. The staff and youth have comfortable interaction. Due to the power outages in Sonoma County, adjustments have been made in all the houses to ensure generators are available in times of power outages.
