CONDITIONS OF SECURE DETENTION

Are minors provided with orientation?

N/A Change in California State law.

Purpose of secure detention: **The purpose of secure detention is primarily ensure the safety of the juvenile as well as the staff. This also includes the safety of the juvenile's legal representation.**

Length of time secure detention expected to last: **Most secure detentions observed were less than 2 hours. The longest detention observed was 5 hours and 40 minutes.**

Maximum six-hour time limit: **No detentions of over 6 hours were reported.**

CONDITIONS OF CELL/LOCKED ROOM

Proximity to adult inmates: **Youth are strictly segregated from adult suspects and inmates**

Ability and frequency of staff to supervise minor: **Since the last inspection the Santa Rosa Police Department completed a major upgrade to the audio/video system. The new system allows for better and more efficient monitoring of juveniles in secure detention. The system stops recording and the audio is turned off when legal representation is present.**

Constant auditory access to staff: **See above.**

Provided with a snack if requested: **Youth are provided snacks if requested.**

Access to toilets and washing facilities: **Easy access to bathroom and washing facilities. Bathrooms are clean and functional.**

Access to drinking fountain or water: **Bottled water is most commonly provided. Cups and are drinking fountain are also available.**

Provisions to provide clothing or blankets to assure comfort:
Both are available if needed for comfort.
